# Perusing Le Laperouse in Sydney

**NOT** even a stormy Sydney evening could dampen the festivities aboard Ponant's Le Laperouse last Fri night, with VIPs, trade partners and media invited to enjoy a lavish dinner and tour of the ship.

The cruise line's local team and crew greeted guests with champagne and canapes on arrival before being taken on an exploration of the 184-passenger Explorer-class ship, including a visit to the Blue Eye Lounge, a unique underwater bar and enrichment area providing glimpses of marine life via large oval windows.

Captain Jean Philippe Lemaire of the Le Laperouse hosted guests in the main dining area as a delectable French-inspired threecourse meal was served.

Sarina Bratton, Chairman Asia Pacific, **pictured** with Lemaire, spoke of the "billion dollars



invested" into new ship builds for Ponant which "allows us to take our guests anywhere in the most environmentally sensitive areas."

"We can do that in the knowledge that we've got the best ships and best technical capability of having sustainable, safe operations," Bratton added. Le Laperouse is currently en

route across the Tasman to New Zealand, where she will undertake a series of NZ coastal voyages between Auckland and Dunedin.

She will then explore the South Pacific in early Apr before heading via the Solomon Islands to Cairns and Papua New Guinea before an extended Kimberley cruise program through winter.

Adrenaline junkies will benefit from the two new slides which will tower 50 metres above the waterline, with one slide containing an 11.3 metre free-fall drop as the capsule floor opens.

"Action-packed waterparks are what Carnival does best," said Carnival Cruise Line Australia Vice President Jennifer Vandekreeke.

"So when Aussies told us it was a favourite feature on *Carnival Spirit* and *Legend*, we wanted to raise the bar when it came to designing a new WaterWorks for Carnival Splendor," she added.


Godmother of the ceremony was Giuliana Rindone, an employee of the Sestri shipyard.

Scarlet Lady will weigh approximately 110,000 gross

tons, be 278 metres long and 38 metres wide, with the vessel to be fitted out with over 1,400 cabins capable of accommodating more than 2,770 passengers and 1,160 crew on board.

Under construction at the same yard is *Scarlet Lady's* sister ship, which will be delivered in 2021, while a third and fourth vessel are scheduled for delivery in 2022 and 2023.

## Captain's Call

Captain Craig Street of Princess Cruises' flagship, Majestic Princess.

#### When did you know you wanted to be a Captain?

This may sound a little cliched however growing up as a child I loved watching *The Love Boat* and from then I always aspired to be Captain Stubing.

On leaving school at the age of 17 I was offered a place at Edinburgh University however I really wanted to travel the world so applied and was offered a place as a Deck Cadet with Princess Cruises.

One of my initial ships was the original Island Princess which, along with the Pacific Princess was used in the filming of the Love Boat.

Although all Deck Officers' ultimate goal and aspiration is to make it to Captain, this always seems a long way off.

Perseverance paid off however, as in 2008 at the age of 36 and one of the youngest Captains ever, I was promoted and first took command of the Star Princess.

### What has been the biggest challenge in your career?

One great thing about being Captain is that I see new things and get challenged on a daily basis, which is one of the reasons why I love my job so much. There is always something new to experience and we never stop learning.

Another really enjoyable aspect of the job is manoeuvring the ship into port; the ship is so large compared



to the available space in some of the ports we visit which presents a real challenge and focuses the mind - especially when the wind is blowing or the current is running.

#### What do you love about the cruise industry?

In general I think that cruising is a great, value for money way to visit new places and experience different cultures around the world.

#### Favourite port that you have visited?

One of my favourite ports in the world has to be Sydney; the sail in and out is absolutely beautiful and iconic with the views of the Opera House and Harbour Bridge. Being on the bridge for arrival in the morning and being able to experience the sunrise while passing through the heads and then rounding Bradleys Head with the incredible skyline coming into view is spectacular and indeed very special.

#### Best place to eat/drink on board Majestic?

This is a difficult one as there is no shortage of restaurants, cafes and bars on the ship with a huge variety and choice. If I had to choose one however I would say my favourite place to eat is at Harmony.

### Cairns gains pace

**THE** Queensland Government has awarded the tender to start dredging and construction on Cairns' \$127 million port upgrade.

RN Dredging Pty Ltd picked up the contract which marks an important next step in the port's refurbishment project.

"By upgrading our port and allowing larger cruise ships to visit the region, it means visitors from across the world will be spending their dollars on local businesses and restaurants," said Speaker of the Qld Parliament Curtis Pitt.

By 2031, it is estimated the Port of Cairns will receive 103 cruise ships annually.
