#### Oceanwide's ship

**OCEANWIDE** Expeditions has ordered a new ship to be constructed called *M/v Janssonius*, which is scheduled to be completed in Oct 2021.

The Polar Class 6 vessel will be a sister ship to the cruise line's existing 174-pax *Hondius* and will embody a near identical size and design.

Features on board the new vessel will include a protected indoor Zodiac loading area that can also be used for sea-based activities such as kayaking, with accommodation options boasting eight superior cabins, 19 twin deluxe cabins, 14 twin window cabins, and 31 twin porthole cabins.

# New exhaust tech adopted by industry

AN UPDATED Cruise Industry Sustainability Guide jointly released by three of Australia and New Zealand's leading cruise organisations shows a large number of ships have adopted new Exhaust Gas Cleaning Systems (EGCS) technology.

The report, tabled by Cruise Lines International Association (CLIA) Australasia, the Australian Cruise Association (ACA), and the New Zealand Cruise Association, cites the new EGCS technology as a major pillar of the industry's strategy to help lower carbon emissions by 40% before 2030 (*CW* 02 Jan).

So far 111 cruise ships have been fitted with EGCS, while a further 42 vessels are due to be retrofitted, and another 27 newbuild ships will adopt the more emissions-friendly tech. The updated sustainability guide states that EGCS has been



shown to reduce the level of sulphur oxides in a ship's exhaust by as much as 98%, offering an alternative to low-sulphur fuels to achieve emission reduction goals.

"EGCS are a key component of the cruise industry's emission reduction strategy, and not withstanding the complexity and cost associated with these systems, cruise lines have pioneered the use of this technology in the marine environment," the report said. Another aspect of the cruise sector's overall carbon reduction plan will include a strong push for new-build ships to operate on LNG, with the updated report showing more than one third of new-build cruise ships in the pipeline will operate using the greener option as their primary propulsion fuel.

CLIA has previously flagged plans to report annually on the industry's progress toward the emissions commitment.

Amenities on the new vessel will boast two passenger decks, eight staterooms, two Signature Suites, cafe and bar lounge area, and a Bodhi Spa offering various wellness treatments for couples and singles. ### A&K Baltic cruise

ABERCROMBIE & Kent (A&K) has announced the launch of a new 2020 cruise of the Baltic Sea sailing from Copenhagen to St Petersburg.

The sailing will explore Denmark, Poland, Lithuania, Sweden, Estonia, Finland and Russia during the voyage, also hosting a program of expert lectures and shore excursions.

Land tours include visits to a former Soviet nuclear missile base in Lithuania, trips to various WW2 sites, and an after-hours visit to the Hermitage Museum in St Petersburg.

Taking place 16-28 Jul, 2020 on board the 148-passenger *Le Dumont d'Urville*, prices lead in at \$15,995 (AU\$23,030) per person, twin share.



### *Vista* takes a break

**CARNIVAL** Cruise Line has announced the cancellation of three of *Carnival Vista's* upcoming sailings due to propulsion problems relating to its azipod thrusters.

As a result, *Vista's* 06 Jul, 13 Jul and 20 Jul departures have all been cancelled while the vessel is taken to a dry dock for an extended period to fix the issue.

"The Carnival Vista has been experiencing an issue affecting its maximum cruising speed... unfortunately we will be unable to operate these voyages, as it is necessary to remove the ship from service to complete the required repairs," the cruise line said in a statement.

Carnival has issued a full refund to affected passengers as well as up to US\$200 to cover required flight changes.

#### Panama Canal fees

**THE** administration body that manages vessel access through the Panama Canal has published a proposal to modify its current tolls structure, which would likely result in increased fees for cruise ships.

The business case put forward by the body is proposing to move from a per berth to a per passenger basis, "making it easier for cruise lines to transfer transit costs to their customers".

"Our proposed modifications will increase transparency and flexibility...to ensure the Panama Canal remains competitive," said Panama Canal Administrator Jorge L Quijano.

The date for implementation is planned for 01 Jan, 2020.
