Carnival in Bahamas



CARNIVAL Corporation has pledged to help fund the restoration of the Rand Memorial Hospital, the main hospital on Grand Bahama Island.

Having suffered severe damage in Hurricane Dorian, the company has signed a memorandum of understanding with the government to repair the building and replace damaged medical equipment for the Freeport institution.

Set to be up and running by Mar, the project will also see the completion of a new kitchen, which was under construction when it was damaged by the storm.

The agreement will see the two parties work alongside Direct Relief, the Grand Bahama Shipyard, the University of Miami and World Central Kitchen, among others.

"In support of overall recovery efforts in The Bahamas, we have worked with government and community leaders to determine meaningful ways we can help that will deliver a lasting impact, and our shared mission to support the restoration of Rand Memorial Hospital exemplifies that commitment," said Carnival Corporation VP of Global Ports and Caribbean Government Relations Marie McKenzie.
