PONANT has expanded its team with the return of former BDM Julie Golding as Key Account Manager.

The appointment rectifies the growing need for additional support for trade and retail consortia, as Ponant continues to experience substantial industry growth.

The role is newly created within Ponant's local set-up, with Golding to report in to Director of Sales Julie Rogers.

Crystal forges ahead with expansion

CRYSTAL Cruises is powering ahead with plans to expand its fleet, firming an agreement to build a third new ocean ship with Italian shipbuilder, Fincantieri.

The latest addition exercises an option held as part of an order placed earlier this year for two new ships, **CW** understands.

The latest newbuild (render pictured), will see Crystal Cruises' fleet rise to five once all ships are delivered, expected to take place in 2028, 2030 and 2032.

Plans for the new ship, which is tentatively set for delivery in 2032, will carry 690 passengers in double occupancy, making her slightly larger than fleet-mate Crystal Symphony but noticeably smaller than Crystal Serenity.

A suite of ultra-modern design and amenity standards will be applied to the new ship, including a wrap-around promenade deck. All-suite accommodations will



include dedicated keys for solo travellers, with many offering private verandahs.

Like Serenity and Symphony, elevated fine dining will be a key focus onboard, with the new ship to feature Umi Uma which will be the only Nobu restaurant at sea.

The popular Japanese global fusion restaurant concept by Chef Matsuhisa and co-owned by Hollywood legend Robert de Niro has expanded around the world but until now has never ventured onto a cruise ship under the Nobu brand.

Other culinary options will

include popular Crystal staples including Beefbar by restaurateur Riccardo Giraudi and dishes from popular chefs Massimiliano and Raffaele Alajmo.

Crystal's latest newbuild will also feature the Casino de MonteCarlo, a new entertainment partnership signed earlier this year (CW 27 Jun) which will debut on Serenity and Symphony in Dec.

"Exercising this option and agreeing to build a third ship together showcases the trust and partnership between my family and Fincantieri, dating back to Sitmar Cruises and evolving through Silversea to our present vision with Crystal," said A&K Travel Group Executive Chairman, Manfredi Lefebvre d'Ovidio.

A&K Travel Group CEO Cristina Levis added she is pleased to bring an expanded fleet to our guests and new ways to explore the world with Crystal." ML

CCL commitment

CARNIVAL Cruise Line says it is committed to offering yearround cruising in Queensland as Carnival Luminosa arrived in Brisbane for its third summer. Next year, Carnival Cruise

Line will base the renamed Carnival Encounter - formerly Pacific Encounter - in Brisbane following the closure of the P&O Cruises Australia brand.

"The decision to keep Carnival Encounter based here in Brisbane year-round is an indication of how much Queenslanders love cruising from their capital city," said Carnival Cruise Line Vice President, Kara Glamore.

The 2,260-passenger Carnival Luminosa will welcome more than 70,000 pax on 24 sailings from Brisbane this summer, visiting destinations including Vanuatu, Papua New Guinea, New Caledonia and North Qld.

Celestyal Qatar boost

CELESTYAL Cruises has signed a three-year Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with Visit Qatar at last week's World Travel Market in London.

The MOU signifies a threeyear commitment to the region, promoting Qatar as a key destination among Celestyal's guests and agents.

"It's a privilege to sign this agreement with Visit Qatar and we would like to thank them for all their support in bringing this partnership to life," said Celestyal Cruises Chief Commercial Officer Lee Haslett.

"Qatar is an extraordinary destination and an ideal fit for our guests who are seeking immersive, culturally rich experiences," he added.

Spectrum gremlins

ROYAL Caribbean has offered \$600 in compensation to passengers onboard Spectrum of the Seas due to a technical issue which saw the ship delayed in Japan for two days.

The line has blamed the issue on "unplanned maintenance" and has been forced to cancel its next sailing to investigate the cause more thoroughly.

"We apologise to our guests for the inconvenience and are communicating with our guests directly," a spokesperson for the line said.

Circle the Pacific

PRINCESS Cruises has launched what it says is its most "destination-rich voyage ever" with a 131-day voyage circling the Pacific Ocean. Replacing its 2026 World Cruise to bypass ongoing hostilities in the Red Sea, the Circle Pacific voyage will depart 05 Jan 2026 from Fort Lauderdale on Coral Princess.

Venturing through the Panama Canal, the ship will sail Hawaii, French Polynesia, the South Pacific, New Zealand and Australia before heading north to Asia and visiting Japan and Alaska before concluding in Los Angeles on 16 May.

Key destinations on the line-up include Fiji, Auckland, Bangkok, Hong Kong, Osaka, Singapore, Sydney and Tahiti, with late-night stays in several ports to allow guests to make the most of their day in port.

Sapphire NE debut

PRINCESS Cruises will introduce Sapphire Princess to the New England and Canada region in 2026 - a year which marks the 250th anniversary of the United States.

To mark the occasion, Sapphire will sail a 14-day 'Canada and Colonial America' itinerary on 23 Oct 2026, which will overnight in New York City and visit Saguenay, Charlottetown, Cape Breton Island and more.

Joining the celebratory year will be Majestic Princess, which will offer seven-day round-trip cruises from New York, calling in Boston and a range of New England towns.

Princess has also launched supplementary Cruisetour land extensions, with multi-day options taking travellers to Washington DC, Niagara Falls, Philadelphia and more.
