Star new features

PRINCESS Cruises' new Star Princess will feature expanded dining venues and leisure experiences, as well as new non-smoking casino areas, when she debuts next year.

The second Sphere-class ship to launch will feature an expanded O'Malley's Irish Pub and Love by Britto, a new SkyDeck Sports Court & Track, and a larger non-smoking area in the casino.

The 4,300-guest ship will also be powered by liquefied natural gas, as well as cuttingedge Sphere-class features such as its namesake glassenclosed piazza, and the geodesic new 'Dome'.

Royal commits four ships to Alaska in '26

ROYAL Caribbean has rolled out new Alaska adventures for 2026, with Voyager of the Seas (pictured) set to make her debut in the state.

The ship will visit Dawes Glacier, Endicott Arm, Juneau, Sitka and Skagway, as well as Icy Strait Point, on seven-night cruises departing Seattle.

The news comes in the wake of a significant victory for the industry in Alaska, as Juneau voters declined to adopt the proposed 'Ship Free Saturdays', which would have seen large cruise vessels banned from the city on a day typically reserved for local recreation (CW 21 Oct).

Meanwhile, Voyager will join Anthem of the Seas, Serenade of the Seas, and Ovation of the Seas as they offer seven-night cruises from Seattle, or 7- to 13-nights from Vancouver or Seward.

Ovation returns as the first in



the action-packed Quantum Class lineup, with overland cruisetours.

Anthem will cruise seven-night vacations from Seattle to explore Skagway, Sitka, Endicott Arm, Dawes Glacier, and Juneau.

Meanwhile, Serenade takes in the sights in between destinations and passages like Icy Strait Point, the majestic Inside

Passage, Juneau, Ketchikan, Sitka, and Tracy Arm fjord.

The new 2026 Alaska vacations are now open for bookings.

Royal Caribbean Group also announced it will construct a new port in Juneau earlier this week - which it later apologised to the city for blindsiding it with the announcement (CW 24 Oct). MS



Kimberley opened

PREVIOUSLY unexplored locations in WA's ultra-remote Kimberley are featured in the new 2026 sailing schedule released by True North.

New for the season is a 13-night 'Kimberley Untold' itinerary, with the line saying guests can gain access to previously unexplored regions and access to "hidden gems".

Also new is a 10-night 'Navigate New Britain' sailing, which takes travellers deep into Papua New Guinea to see village traditions, explore coral reefs and enjoy sport-fishing.

Ahead of 2026, the line said both True North and True North II will be completely refreshed with improvements to the daytime areas onboard.

Cruise law victory

THE cruise industry has scored a victory in an American court, which ruled against an earlier decision finding a number of major cruise companies guilty in engaging in illegal tourism to Cuba between 2015 and 2019.

The earlier decision found Carnival Corporation, Royal Caribbean Group, MSC Cruises and Norwegian Cruise Line Holdings liable for US\$439 million in damages to Havana Docks Corp, which had their shoreside assets confiscated by Castro (CW 05 Jan 2023).

G ADVENTURES has announced the launch of a fleet of five yachts for next year, purpose-built to sail in Greece.

The five vessels are spacious and stylish, with each carrying 10 travellers in five cabins, which can be configured as either a twin or a double, all of which are equipped with bedside reading lights and USB ports.

Each vessel also features a fullyequipped galley, a comfortable communal area, and a sundrenched deck perfect for lazy sea days, which is also fitted with an outdoor shower to hose off after swimming.

Each sailing is led by a qualified 'Skipper CEO' (chief experience officer), knowledgeable about the islands, and hidden spots far away from the well-known tourist destinations.

The shoreside experiences ensure travellers interact with locals and support communities that may not usually see a lot of

The five vessels will be deployed in Greece between now and Jun, ahead of the 2025 season, which will run from Apr to Oct.

commitment to sustainability and community tourism.

"All five boats have been fitted with solar panels and state-ofthe-art engines and generators that minimise environmental impact without sacrificing performance," he said.

"Recycled and natural materials have been prioritised in the boats' construction, ensuring all materials used are free from harmful substances.

"This commitment to the environment and spreading tourism dollars to lesser-visited communities on smaller Greek Islands really sets the bar high for operators in the region, and ensures we'll deliver an incredible experience for our travellers that is simultaneously kind to our planet and its people."
