Alaska tax lawsuit

CRUISE Lines International Association (CLIA) is suing the Alaskan town of Skagway over its new tax policy, which changes how the destination levies shore excursions.

Skagway late last year approved a tweak to its tax code to collect levies on the full price cruise passengers pay for their shore excursion, which includes the commission the lines charge.

"We oppose provisions of Ordinance No. 24-12 that violate the U.S. Constitution and Alaska state law by imposing new and duplicative taxes on shore excursions sold by cruise lines," a CLIA spokesperson told local media.

Fiji's first cruise turnaround



FIJI successfully hosted its first major ship turnaround earlier this month, when Norwegian Cruise Line's Norwegian Sun docked at Queens Wharf in Lautoka, disembarking 2,000 passengers.

Ground operator Rosie Fiji Cruises, along with Fiji Ports, port agencies, government border agencies, and more, came together to tackle a logistical challenge not seen before on this scale in the destination, reports FBC News.

The turnaround - the disembarkation of one group of passengers and embarkation of the next - is the first of three Fiji will host this year.

Turnarounds are far more valuable than regular cruise calls, as passengers engage with the destination's accommodation, transfers, hospitality, and other sectors with the tourism industry.

Rosie Travel Group General Manager Eroni Puamau described the turnaround as a defining moment for Fiii's cruise sector.

Adding his plaudits was Tourism Fiii Chief Executive Officer Brent Hill, who said the turnaround of Sun (pictured) proves the destination can handle more cruise capacity.

Hill has long been an advocate for more cruise capacity to

Fiji, previously calling on lines to home port a ship in the destination (CW 13 May).

Adding to the country's attraction as a cruise home port destination is the recent growth of its flag carrier Fiji Airways, which has expanded its international network and increased flight frequencies, making it easier for travellers from key source markets such as Australia and the United States to access the island nation.
